GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Purpose of the Challenge:

To assess the contestant's ability in sewing construction related to the field of fashion technology

Instructions:

- Using the pattern chosen by the committee, create the required garment in size 10. Patterns have been purchased by Career Transitions and will be sent to the school once online registration has closed on March 12, 2010.
- Competitors should arrive with pattern pinned and ready to cut on the morning of the contest. Competitors will be given time to layout their pattern so that it can be judged prior to the competition start time. **DO NOT** cut prior to the contest.
- The **Garment Information Sheet** (see attached) must accompany your pattern layout on the morning of the competition. Please **staple a 2 inch by 2 inch swatch of the main fabric** you are using to the Garment Information Sheet.
- The competitors will be divided into two different rooms based on a random draw. Every effort will be made to ensure the rooms are equal in all aspects that pertain to the competition. The committee cannot ensure that competitors planning to share equipment will be in the same room, it is suggested that all students have all of their own equipment.
- Students are encouraged to sew a practice garment at home or school, in order to establish assembly techniques and timelines for completion.
- Competition assistants will be available in each room throughout the contest. Assistants may be approached with questions about machine issues but should not be relied upon to provide garment construction support.
- It is recommended that competitors label all equipment. Career Transitions and/or Lethbridge College are not responsible for any equipment.
- Visitors (including friends, family members, classmates, and teachers, etc.) will not be allowed to enter competition rooms without permission from the Skills Expert in the room. Communication with competitors could result in points being deducted from the competitor's final score

JUDGING CRITERIA

Competitors will be judged on the following criteria:

- Pattern Layout
- Waistline Finish
- Hem Finish
- Seams
- Seam Finishes
- Zipper Application
- Waistline Closure
- Design Details
- Finishing
- Fabric Choice



EQUIPMENT & MATERIALS

Equipment and Materials Supplied by Committee:

- Pattern (the pattern has been purchased by the committee– the pattern will be sent to your school once your online registration closes on March 12, 2010)
- Seam rolls/hams
- A station for each competitor including:
 - a 3 ft. by 6 ft. table
 - chair
 - electrical outlet (students may bring their own power bar)

*The committee has a limited number of sewing machines, sergers, irons and ironing boards that will be available in case of equipment malfunction

Equipment and Materials Supplied by Competitor:

- Sewing machine, needles, thread and bobbins
- Serger
- Iron and ironing board with cover
- A power bar and/or extension cord is recommended
- Fabric
 - price of fabric is NOT to exceed \$15.00 per metre
 - fabric choice may include a main fabric as well as a coordinating fabric
- Students may purchase garment notions prior to the competition (notions may include fasteners and any fabric or trims used for lining, interfacing or accenting main fabric)
- Each competitor will be reimbursed \$40.00 to help offset the cost of fabric and notions used for the competition and preparation
- Equipment and supplies needed to construct garment (e.g.: tape measure, pins, scissors, marking equipment, etc.)
- skirt hanger with clips to display your garment
- Please label all personal equipment

IMPORTANT GENERAL INFORMATION

Safety Requirements

Students are expected to adhere to all safety requirements outlined in orientation

Clothing Requirements

Competitors are expected to wear clean and appropriate attire; no open-toe shoes allowed
Cell phones are not allowed in the competition area
