#### GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Enable industry to view the level of skill taught within the secondary institutions, and encourage interaction between the two sectors. This working relationship will help ensure that the skills students gain in secondary education meet the demands of industry. The competition also challenges students in hairstyling and promotes this career area.

#### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The junior (grade 10 & 11) test will be based on creative impression and ability. **This may be a combination of 2 or more of ropes, knots, twists and braids.** This will be completed on a long hair mannequin.

#### EQUIPMENT & MATERIALS

##### Equipment and Materials Competitors Must Supply:

- Must provide their own long hair mannequin and stand (no body mannequins & no neon colors).
- Must supply their own working tools and equipment, which should include the following: water bottle, towels, cape, combs, brushes, clips, hairpins, etc. (hair dryers must not require more than 1800 watts).
- Must bring his/her preferred types of styling products (all product labels must be covered)
- Are encouraged to provide their own mannequin make-up, jewelry, and draping.
- Clean and comfortable work attire as would be worn in a modern hair salon. Also, appropriate footwear must be worn (no platform, high heeled, or open toed shoes).

##### Equipment and Materials Supplied by the Committee:

Each contestant will have a table, a mirror, a non-hydraulic chair, and a single electrical outlet provided for their use.

#### SAFETY

The health, safety and welfare of all individuals involved with Skills Canada Alberta are of vital importance. Safety is a condition of participation with Skills Canada Alberta and shall not be sacrificed for the sake of expediency. At the discretion of the judges and technical committees, any competitor can be denied the right to participate should they not have the required proper safety equipment and/or act in an unsafe manner that can cause harm to themselves or others.

**JUDGING CRITERIA**

- All judging will be performed according to the Master Judges System when in place for that competition for that region. The contestants with the most points from the test will be the winner, the second highest mark will be placed second, and the third highest mark will be third.
- Demerits may be given for any rule infractions.
- Any communication between audience and competitor during contest times may be seen as coaching and could cause demerits to be awarded.
- Mannequin will be displayed on the table facing the mirror with a regular stand – no tripods.

### Test # 1: Creative Braid: Must be Commercial & Wearable

#### Objective:

- The contestant will use their imagination in order to create a style that incorporates 75% of roping, knotting, braiding, and weaving and which best displays their artistic ability. The style would still be acceptable for a client to wear to a special occasion and should not be fantasy.
- The competitors will handle hair confidently, brush, comb, and part hair correctly, and create ropes, knots, braids & weaves.
- Hair must be completely dry and brushed through at the beginning of the contest.
- Hair/bobby pins, colored spray, ribbons, jewelry and ornaments may be used to enhance the design.

#### Judging Criteria:

- The difficulty, cleanliness, balance and form, and creativity will form the basis of the judging for this competition.
- Hair pieces or ornaments made of hair will not be allowed.
- All judging will be performed according to a criterion based system.
- Demerits may be given for any rule infractions.
- Any communication between audience and competitor during contest times may be seen as coaching and could cause demerits to be awarded.
- Mannequin will be displayed on the table facing the mirror with a regular stand – no tripods.

### COMPETITION RULES

Failure to comply with the following rules will result in a loss of points (outlined on the following page). Organizers will be closely monitoring the competition, and will be recording infractions. These infractions will be tallied and deducted from the total points earned in that portion of the competition.

- Competitors must be prepared to start on time.
- Competitors MUST adhere to contest timelines. When the timer goes off, you must stop working. (Organizers will make announcements at the 10 minute and 5 minute points prior to the end of each portion of the competition.)
- Visitors (including friends, family members, classmates, and teachers etc.) will be allowed to view the contest, but will NOT be allowed to communicate with the competitors. Communication between competitors will not be allowed during the competition.
- Any questions from the competitors must be directed to the competition sages and not to teachers.
- Mannequin hair must be dry at the beginning of competition but may be wet down as you go.
- All tools are permitted including hot tools (irons, dryers, etc.).
- Competitor must supply own tools and *professional* styling products, as the sharing of tools and products will not be allowed.
- Hair extensions, hairpieces, ornaments made of hair, color sprays and glitter sprays are not permitted.
- Equipment and station must be sanitary prior to the competition and maintained throughout.

- Hands must be washed or sanitized before and after the competition.

- Workstation set-up must be functional and neat.
- Draping used on live models will be removed for judging.
- Competitors are expected to demonstrate professionalism throughout the day.
- Competitors and models must refrain from talking on cell phones during the competition.
- Competitors must wear appropriate footwear (no platform, high heeled or open toed shoes).
